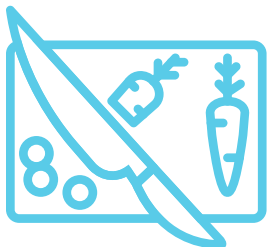


Vision Clinic provided 58 eye exams and access to prescription glasses for uninsured neighbors.

Next-Step Services



Nutrition Education Cooking Class provided a hands-on cooking education experience in our demo kitchen for 62 individuals.



Mobile Food Pantry provided shelf stable foods, fresh produce, and meat to 1,077 households.



1,012 Households received home food delivery. We provided 1,979 food boxes to community agencies.



Chaplaincy Ministry met with 999 individuals for prayer and personal ministry.
